### First Reading: Isaiah 61:7-11

Because [the] shame [of God's people] was double,

and dishonor was proclaimed as their lot,

therefore in their land they shall possess a double portion;

everlasting joy shall be theirs.

I will faithfully give them their recompense, and I will make an everlasting covenant with them.

<sup>10</sup> I will greatly rejoice in the Lord; my whole being shall exult in my God,

for he has clothed me with the garments of salvation;

he has covered me with the robe of righteousness, as a bridegroom decks himself with a garland and as a bride adorns herself with her jewels.

# Pastoral Reflection - Part 1 - "This Was A Royal Announcement"

Second Reading: Galatians 4:4-7

When the fullness of time had come, God sent his Son, born of a woman, born under the law, <sup>5</sup> in order to redeem those who were under the law, so that we might receive adoption as children. <sup>6</sup> And because you are children, God has sent the Spirit of his Son into our hearts, crying, "Abba! Father!" <sup>7</sup> So you are no longer a slave but a child, and if a child then also an heir through God.
